TULIP is the web-based licensure system for the Health and Humans Services Commission. The Texas Unified Licensure Information Portal is designed for licensed long-term care providers. The system is designed to be more efficient, including electronic payments and instant access to licensure information. Providers are required to submit all licensing applications through TULIP, as the agency no longer accepts paper applications. TULIP can be overwhelming to hospices and this presentation will provide information on the new system and how to gain access and where to find additional resources.

PASRR and Hospice

Valerie Krueger, Mental Health PASRR Program Specialist, and Terry Hernandez, QIDP, CMP, and CTCM, Program Manager for the HHSC PASRR Unit at Texas Health and Human Services

Pre-admission Screening and Resident Review (PASRR) is a federally mandated program that requires all states to pre-screen all individuals, regardless of payor source or age, seeking admission to a Medicaid certified nursing facility to identify whether a person is suspected of having mental illness (MI), intellectual disability (IDT) or development disability/related condition (DD/RC). This presentation will cover the role of hospice providers and nurses as referring entities in PASRR. We will discuss hospice recipient's eligibility for PASRR Specialized Services, the Intent of PASRR Specialized Services, required participation of Hospice Provider at IDT meeting, IDT Consensus on recipient receiving PASRR specialized services, and NF authorizations.
